Funding for Professional Development

Title I, Title II and Title III funds can be used.

Title I program and use of funds:

- to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency in challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.
- closing the achievement gap between high- and low-performing children, especially the achievement gaps between minority and non-minority students, and between disadvantaged children and their more advantaged peers.
- providing children with an enriched and accelerated educational program, including the use of schoolwide programs or additional services that increase the amount and quality of instructional time.

Title II funds:

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act, Title II is designed, among other things, to provide **all students** with greater access to effective educators.

Forums to leverage teacher expertise and leadership

Title III

Title III, Section 3301 a language instruction educational program is defined as a program of instruction: "...that may make instructional use of both English and the native language to enable the child to develop and attain English proficiency and may include the participation of English proficient children if such course us design to enable all participating children to become proficient in English and a second language."
